



**12th Annual

Kayak Fishing Tournament**



**Sept 18 & 19, 2010**

**Rules**

Honor system - competitors are trusted not to fish before official start time, or to use disallowed means of fishing.

1) The public as well as Hui Wa'a Kauahi members may compete.

2) Entry fee is \$20 per Club member, \$35 for non-members, paid in advance, or \$25 and \$40 on Saturday or Sunday, payable at the Flag or finish area. Membership in the American Canoe Association (ACA) is also required, non-members can file a \$5.00 Event Waiver at the start of fishing. Registration coupon can be mailed or emailed (see below), and once registration is received, payment can be brought to the finish area on Saturday without penalty.

3) Tournament fishing hours are **First Light to 2:00 pm**. Kayaks may start from anywhere within the Park (for example, the Kam Hwy Beach next to the Gate.) but must be back at the finish area in Campground 'A' by **2:00 pm each day** for their catch to qualify. **(The finish area will be flying a large yellow Club flag )** Catches will be weighed at that time (End Of Fishing), and prizes will be awarded on Sunday at EOF, following final weighing and tallying, and followed by a party with pupus and BYO refreshments.

4) All fishing must be done from a kayak, with a line. To count, fisherman must be in the kayak when fish is hooked.

5) There are no geographical limits to the fishing area, except the Coconut Island Marine Exclusion Area, and of course, the MCBH security zone (500 yards clearance around Mokapu Base).

6) **All kayaks must start from Kualoa Park!** Since the park gate opens at 7:30 AM, you may want to park on the road and launch from the north beach. (You must be pre-registered to do this)

There will be a Grand Prize for **Biggest Papio\*** - see note below

And a Second Prize for **Biggest Other Fish**

and additional prizes for 2nd biggest fish, the most unusual fish, whatever.

**Please Note:** There will be no prizes awarded for most number of fish, or for most total weight. This year we are encouraging contestants to participate in the **Pacific Ocean Producers tag-and-release program**. We will provide participants with fish tags and data cards at the beginning of the tournament. Any papio caught which is over State minimum size but which you do not wish to keep as an entry, may be tagged and released. Each fish released (up to a total of 3 per contestant) earns a ticket in the program. The winner will be picked by lottery on Sunday at the end of the contest, and the prize awarded by the POP representative

**For the purposes of this contest** - a "*Papio*" is defined as a fish of any of the trevally species (ulua, kagami, 'omilu, Giant trevally GT, etc.) that is **10 pounds or less**. - i.e. if it is 10.1 pounds, it is an ulua and will count towards the Biggest Fish prizes. State minimum legal size is 10 inches (fork length) and Contest minimum weight is 1 pound.
